Prince 2 Training Course

I'd been working in project world for around 3 years and still encountered problems through not having a full understanding of the different aspects of project management. These problems were resolved through increased communication but I wanted to minimise or eliminate unnecessary problems arising. The Prince2 (foundation) course provided this understanding and lays down a common approach to project management, helping each different component have an appreciation of the common goals and everyone's role in achieving these goals. Since completing the Prince2 course, I have

taken steps to ensure my area tailors their efforts to dovetail with the Change/IT areas, maximising the impact of our efforts, while minimising unnecessary interruptions to progress.

On a more personal level, any formal qualifications are good for the CV and one of my colleagues, who attended the same course, has recently moved into a Project Manager role – with the Prince2 course helping him greatly in this new role.
