This month is all about Maths and it's importance in everyday life, we have 3 steps to help you upskill.

Step 1 - Checking your level

Lets get you started, take our SkillCheck - Maths

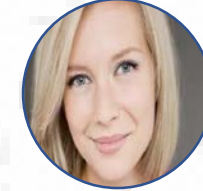

Step 2 - It's finally here - take the Numeracy challenge

The Challenge is a confidential and informal website which helps you to assess your numeracy, learn everyday maths, gain confidence, and work towards getting the Essentials of Numeracy - the basic skills which you need in daily life and the workplace.

1. Take the Check-Up. This is a set of questions which helps you find out the overall numeracy level you're working at, as well as your strengths and weaknesses. It usually takes 20 to 40 minutes, but you can take as long as you need. You can log out and come back to it too. If you score 80 or more, then you've already got the Essentials of Numeracy and you can print a certificate or claim a digital badge.

2. Get a target. If you score 79 or less, then you'll get a target to work towards.

3. Learn. The Challenge then directs you to the right learning resources for you. Take your time, visit the resources and learn everyday maths online at your own pace.

4. The Check-Up. When you feel ready, re-take the Check-Up to see if you have reached your target

Step 3 - Learning Maths Elsewhere



Take your next step; if you have ever wanted to improve on your Maths grade, now you can. If you don't already hold a Level 2 (A-C grade)

If you only managed a D to E grade there is funding to be able to retake for free.

The Numeracy Challenge can help you get ready for this too. After taking the Check-Up, you can print out the list of topics that you might need help with and then show these to your tutor.

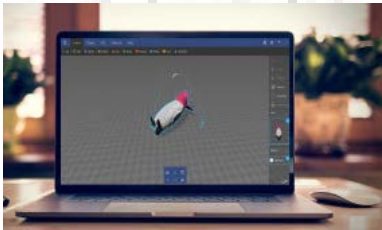


Prepare to Run a Code Club: 3 weeks, 1 hour a week (Free Online)

This short course will give you the confidence and skills to run a Code Club for young people and inspire the next generation to get excited about computing and digital making.

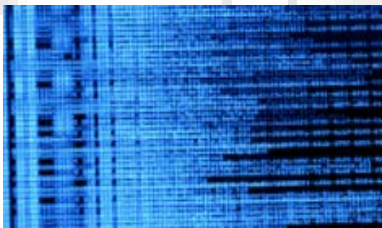
You'll get practical advice and tips from volunteers, teachers, and the Code Club team, and you'll explore the free resources which Code Club provides.



3D Printing with Windows 10: 1 - 2 hours (Free Online)

The course 3D Printing with Windows 10 introduces you to the world of 3D printing and how it has developed to become an accessible tool for different users and developers. This course will teach you about 3D printing through the use of videos to help you gain a clearer insight into the practical side of how 3D printing works.

You will be given an insight into the difference between a 3MF file and an STL file and also the two classes of scenarios for adding 3D printing to any app. The course also shows you how the different features in a 3D builder operates.



Designing the user interface: Text, colour, images, moving images and sound: 4 hours, Level 3: Advanced (Free Online)

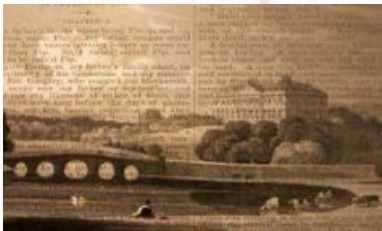

This free course, Designing the user interface, will help you understand the effect each software component has on the user and explain how a consistent and thoughtful application of these components can have a significant impact on the look of the final product.

Introducing the Art of Negotiation: 1 - 2 Hours (Free Online)

The ability to negotiate effectively is an art form which many of us are not confident in doing. Formal negotiations are however, a vital part of communication across various sectors from business to politics. You will also learn why the skill of really listening is of vital importance when meeting goals at the negotiation table. This negotiating course will be of interest to all professionals in many varied sectors such as business, entrepreneurship, human resources and management who are looking for guidance on the art and practise of successful negotiation.



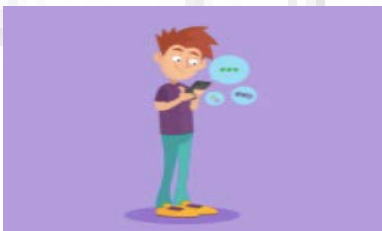
Literature of the English Country House: 6 weeks, 3 hours a week (Free Online)

Investigate and discuss the role and representation of the English country house in literature, and learn how to build your own authoritative interpretation of these texts.

For over 450 years, country houses have attracted the attention of celebrated writers like Jane Austen and Charles Dickens. We'll trace this history with experts from the University of Sheffield's School of English who will share with us the approaches that they take in their own research.

How To Talk To Teenagers 5 mins reading over 10 days

Do you have a teenager? Or a kid who already seems to be acting like one? Parent-teen communication is usually difficult because it requires a new set of skills. It isn't that these new skills are hard or complicated—they're just different. However, many parents think they can keep using the same strategies that worked in their own childhood. This course is not about earlier curfews, more drug and alcohol lectures, and less freedom on social media; it's about changing the way you communicate. Over ten lessons, you'll learn a simple, science-based system for getting through to teenagers about important issues.

The autistic spectrum: From theory to practice: 20 Hours, Level 2, Intermediate (Free Online)

Most of us have a very vague and narrow concept of what autism is, based mainly on such stereotypes as Dustin Hoffman's character in the film Rain Man. In this free course, The autistic spectrum: From theory to practice, you will discover that there is a wide spectrum of disorders associated with autism, and an equally wide range of approaches to diagnosis and treatment.



Introduction to Caregiving: 1 - 2 hours (Free Online)

This free course will also be of great interest to any learner considering pursuing a qualification that would allow them to enter the caregiving industry.

This course will help you develop the fundamental skills used by carers during their day-to-day duties. You will learn about the basic legal and ethical issues of providing care and develop an understanding of the importance of confidentiality in the caregiving process.



Beyond the Ballot: Women's Rights and Suffrage from 1866 to Today: 3 weeks, 3 hours a week: (Free Online)

On this course you will travel back to the nineteenth century to explore the legal, social and economic frameworks that limited women's rights prior to the vote and discover the pioneering women campaigning for change. You will learn the story of how and why the vote was extended to women in 1918, the movements behind this change and how the struggle for equality continued throughout the twentieth century.
